Where are they now?

Ask Tanja and James Jarrell and their 10-year-old daughter Shannon: There is something about the outside of a horse that is good for the inside of a young girl.

Shannon breaks into a wide smile every time she visits their 4-year-old Thoroughbred filly Gypsy, who was known as Nottawatch on the racetrack. The Jarrells, who adopted Gypsy through TROT (Thoroughbred Retirement of Tampa, Inc.) on March 31, 2011, live only a few minutes from where Gypsy is kept in Pinellas Park by their friends, Kimber and John Paetzold.

"Shannon doesn't really like the cleaning-up part yet," said her mom, "but she likes riding. And Gypsy is so kind. She knows when a little person is on her, and she goes at a slow tempo with her."

Gypsy resides with a Quarter Horse named Bee and a Tobiano Paint gelding named Calvin. Tanja, who works as a convenience store manager, helped care for them for several years, but she hadn't thought about getting her own horse until she received a 20 percent raise last year.

That rekindled the horse lover in Tanja, a native of Switzerland who won a gold medal in vaulting at the 1994 World Equestrian Games in the Netherlands with seven teammates and her Swiss-bred horse, Casanova.

Tanja also won gold medals in vaulting in the 1991 and '93 European Championships and numerous silver medals in the sport. Vaulting is best described as "gymnastics performed on a can-

tering horse," with vaulters leaping on and off the horse and performing gymnastics movements on its back while the horse is controlled in a circle on a lunge line.

The Jarrells say Gypsy has been a pleasure to own and care for from the beginning. "We wanted to make sure we took it easy with her, because she had only been off the track about two months," Tanja said.

"We had a vet check her and there were no injuries, but she was very stiff. We slowly changed her food and put her on hoof and joint supplements. Since then, we haven't seen her get stiff or move funny."

After turning her out by herself for six weeks, the Jarrells decided to allow Gypsy to socialize. She and Calvin are now virtually inseparable.

Tanja said Gypsy is highly agreeable to being ridden. "She reacts very good to cues," she said. "At the beginning she wouldn't trot, but I just had to back her up and try again. The big thing was staying patient. I keep Shannon on a lunge line with her because she is not an experienced rider yet, but she can walk and trot on her."

Shannon loves Gypsy for her kindness and intelligence. While the Jarrells hope to be able to compete at local shows with her, their ultimate goal for Gypsy is basic.

We want to see that she lives a happy life and has no major health problems," Tanja said.
